

Drive against oral cancer launched

Nagpur: The number of oral cancer cases has been increasing at an alarming speed and youngsters are prone to the disease mainly due to addiction to tobacco related products, said Dr Vinay Hazarey, former dean of Government Dental College and Hospital, on Thursday.

Addressing a press conference organized at Press Club as part of 'Early detection of oral cancer campaign', launched by Indoco Remedies Limited, Hazarey said people should take immediate medication if there are indications of cancer.
